On October 28, the valedictory ceremony saw Ryan Senapati walking away with Best School Delegation Trophy.

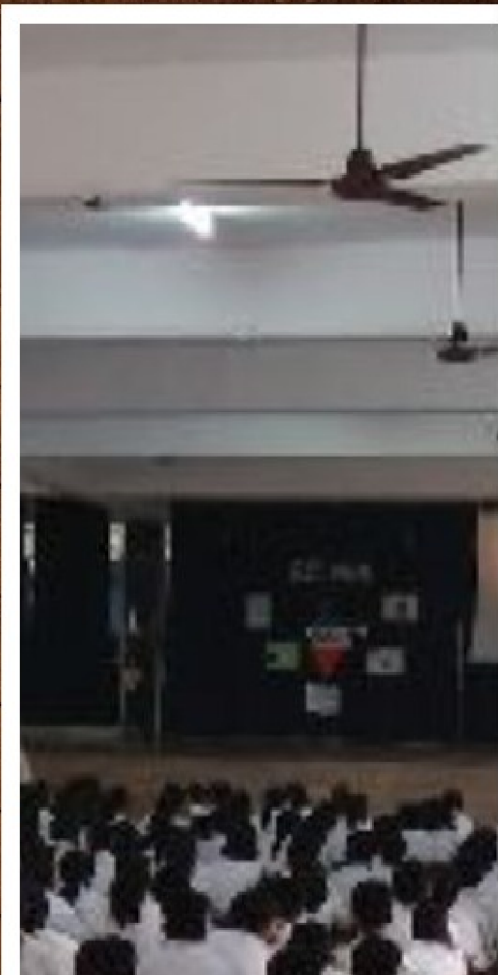
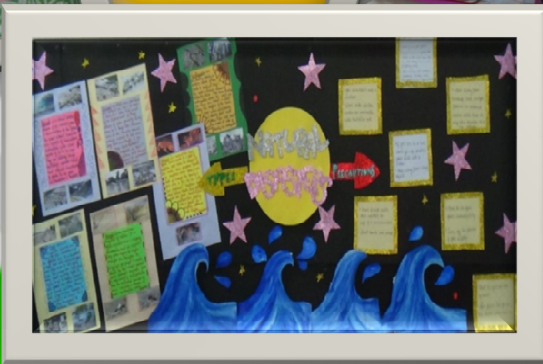




SST WEEK
