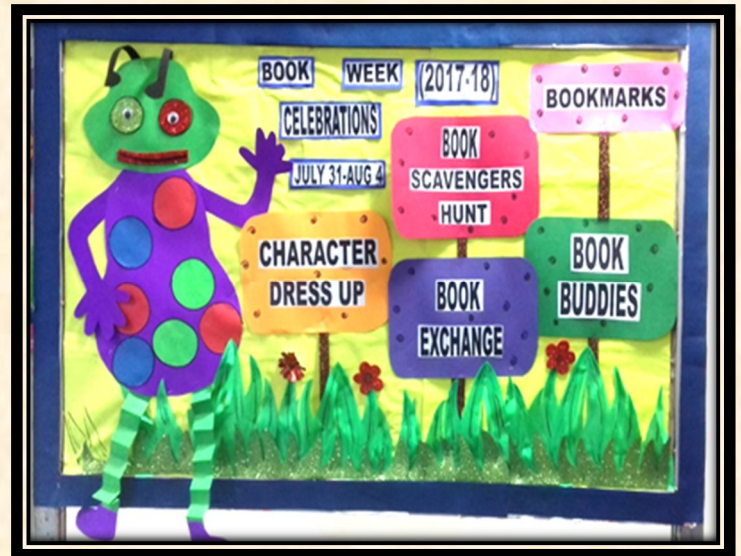

Utsav Gupta of Grade III Bluebells won the Gold Medal and Hunar Kathuria of Grade V Camellia won the Bronze medal at District Level.

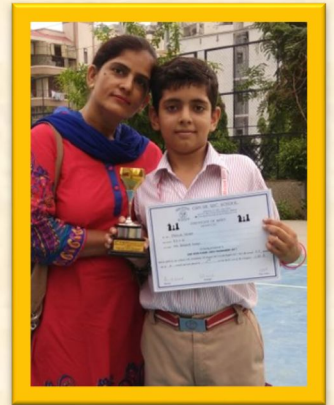


Arshia Wadera of Grade IV won the III prize in "On The Spot Drawing and Colouring Competition" held at Modern School, Sector -88
