On the occasion of World Photography Day, students of the Primary Wing engaged themselves in different activities like collage making, photo frame etc.



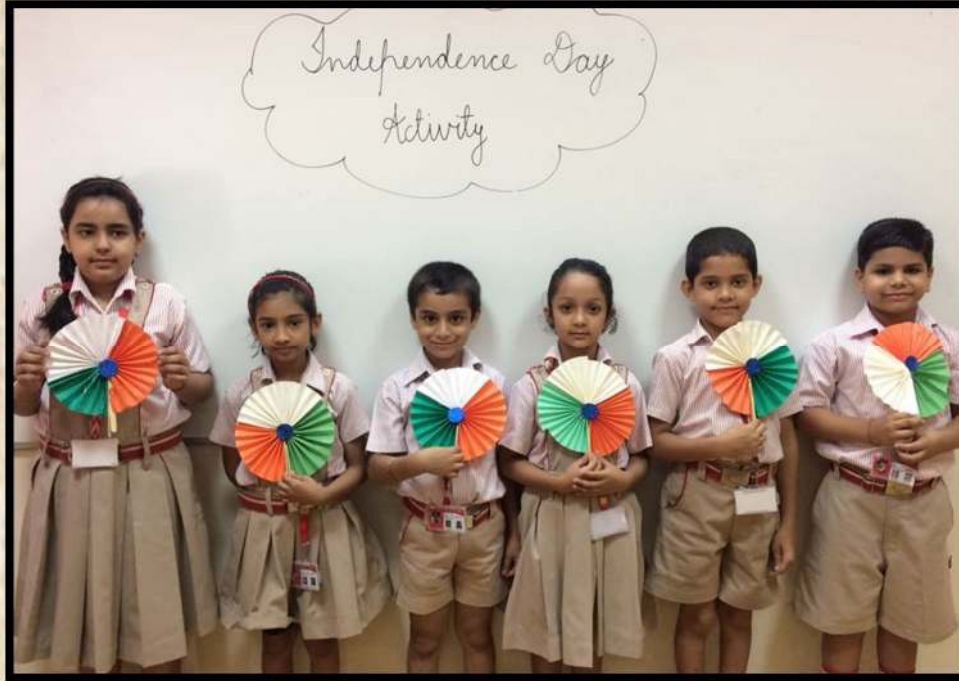
