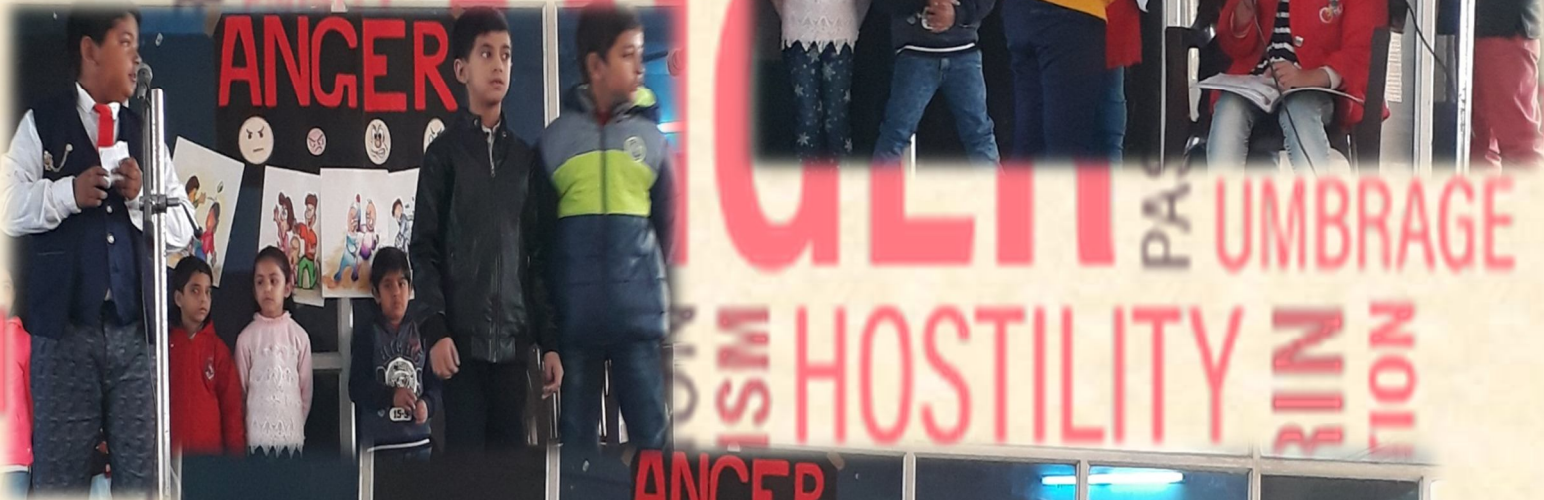
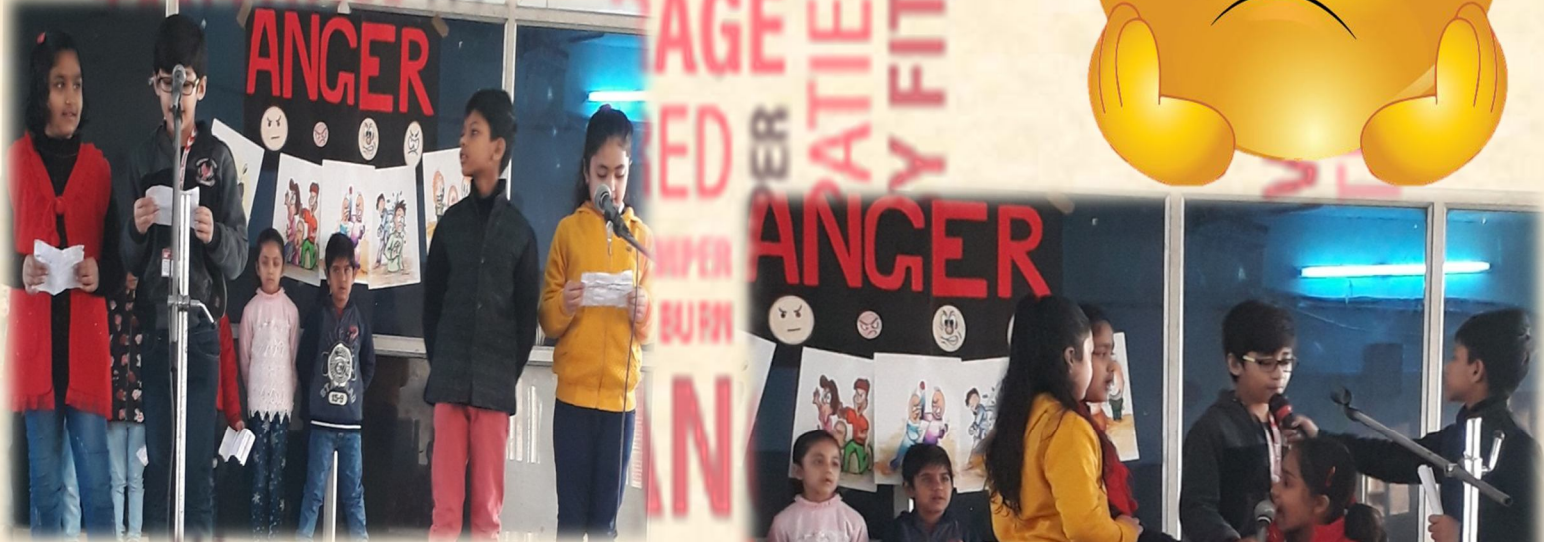
# INCRECIBLE INDIA

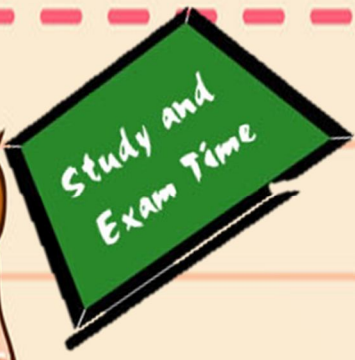

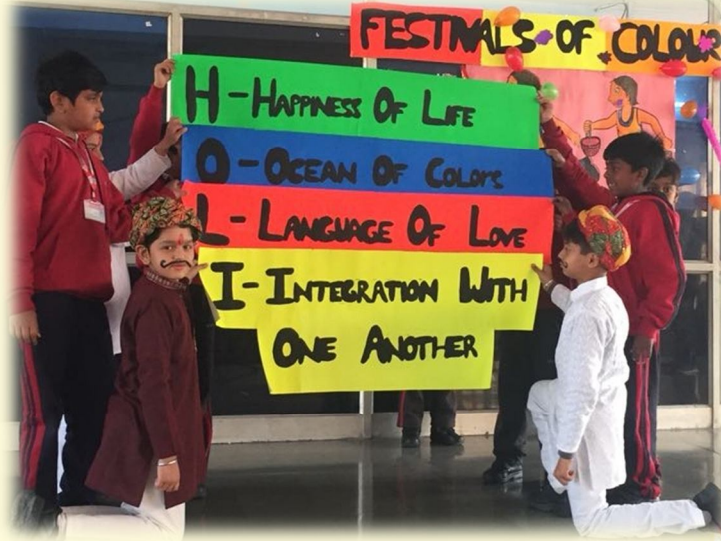
