# KINDNESS

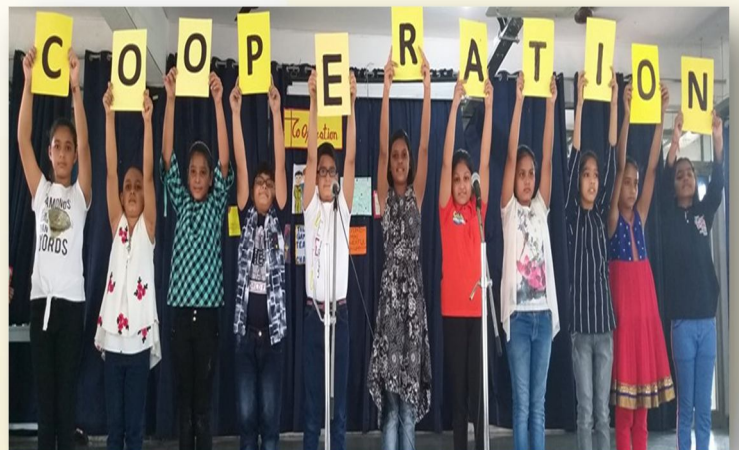
Little deeds of kindness,

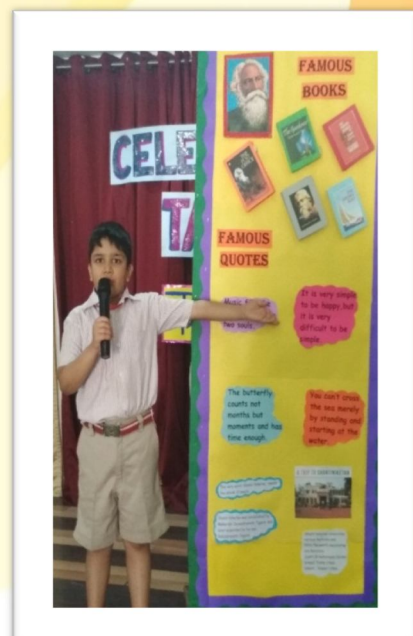


# TAGORE WEEK

The students of Grade V showed their culinary skills by making a variety of mouth-watering mango dishes.





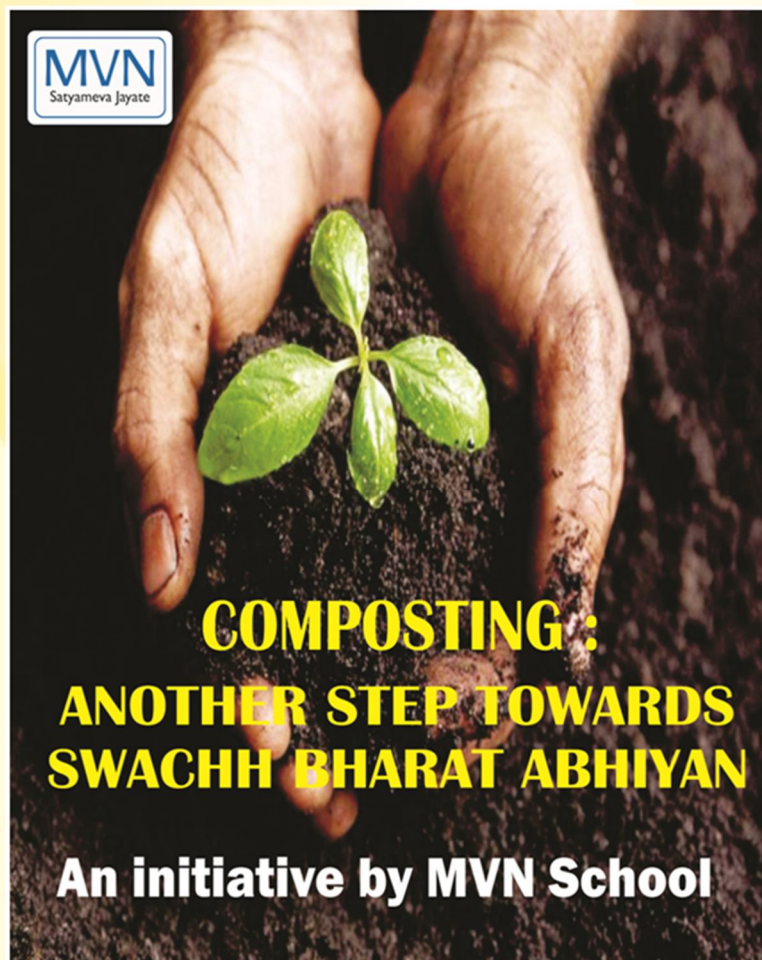
# COMPOSTING DRIVE

MVN planned a host of activities to keep children engaged during the summer vacation to hone the artistic skills of the children at the same time improving their physical fitness.

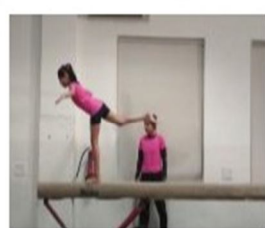

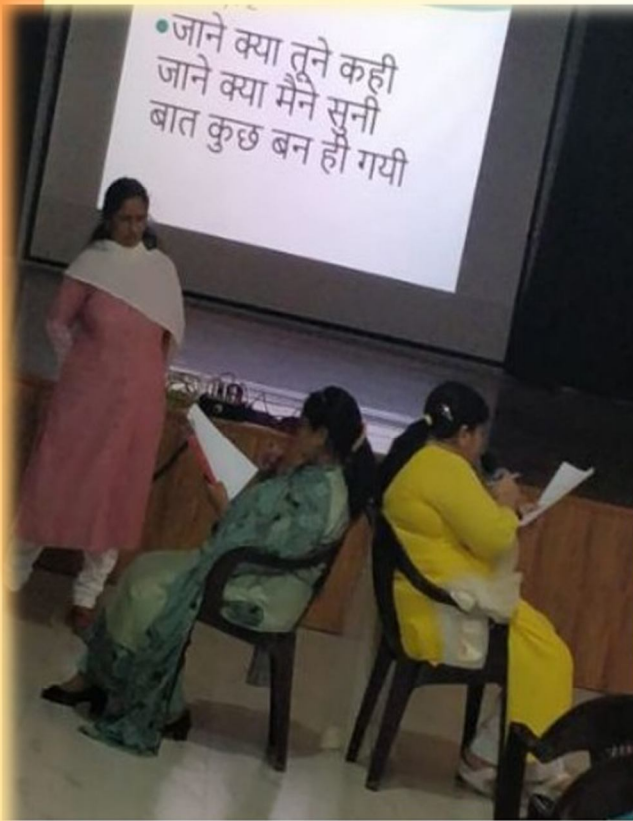




# ART & SCIENCE OF COMMUNICATION
