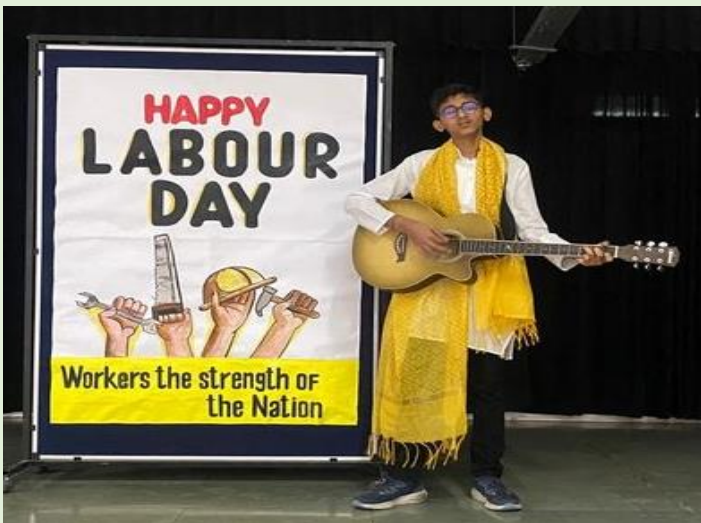

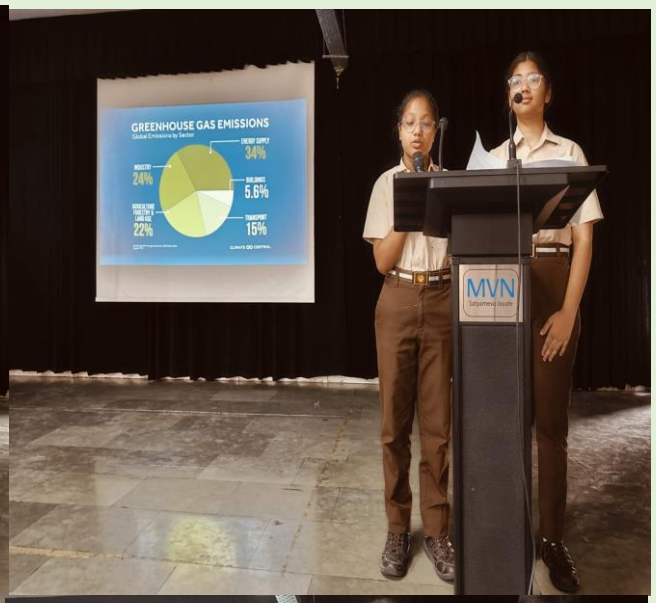


# EMPOWERING CHANGE: SMALL EFFORTS TO FIGHT CLIMATE CHANGE

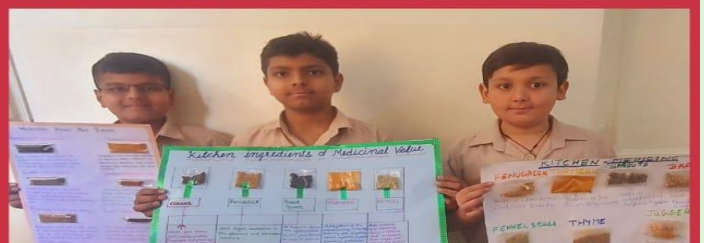
As part of Science Week on Day 3, students of classes VI and VI delved into the fascinating world of herbal medicines. This segment aimed at educating students about the medicinal

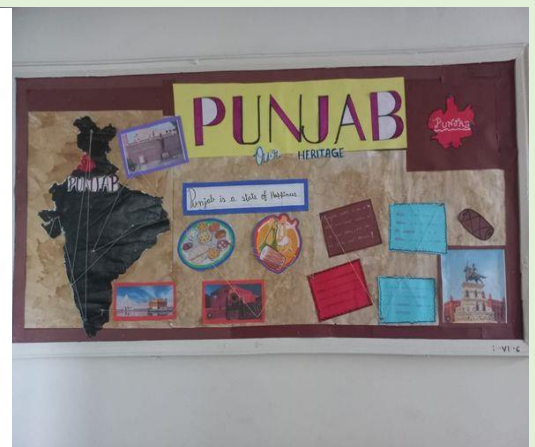


# ACTIVITIES

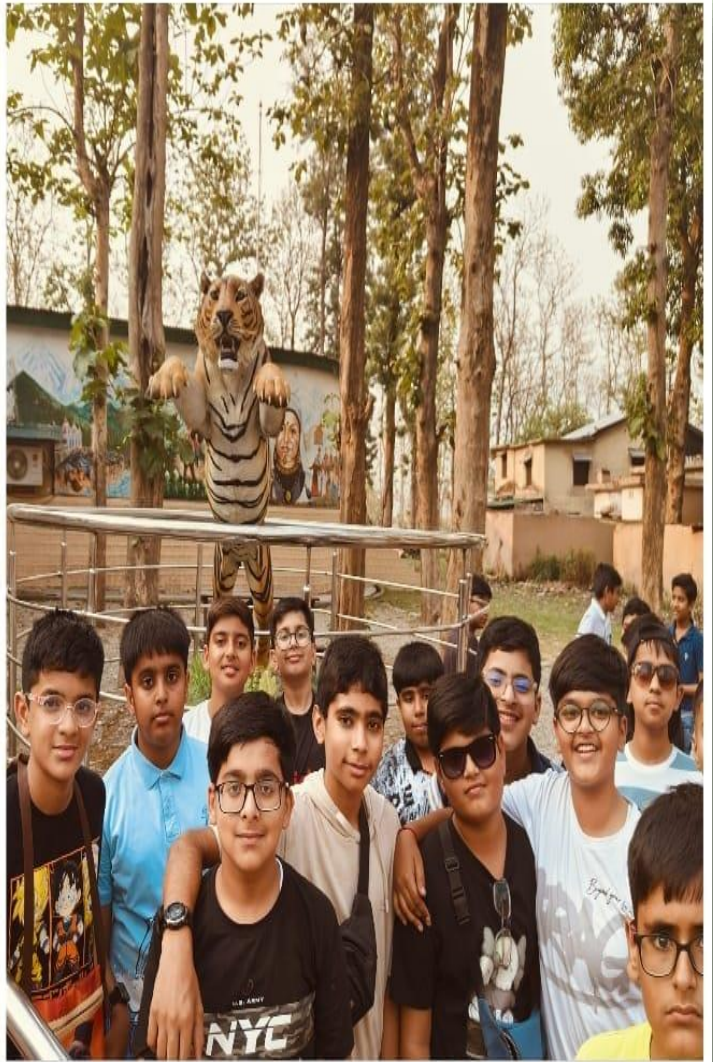

# PARENT -TEACHER MEET AT MVN 17

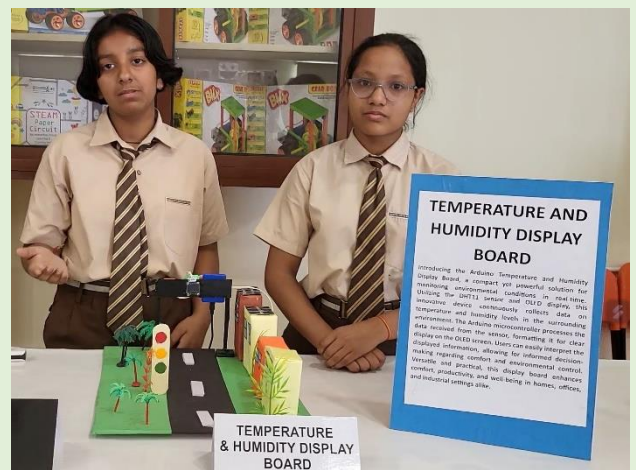
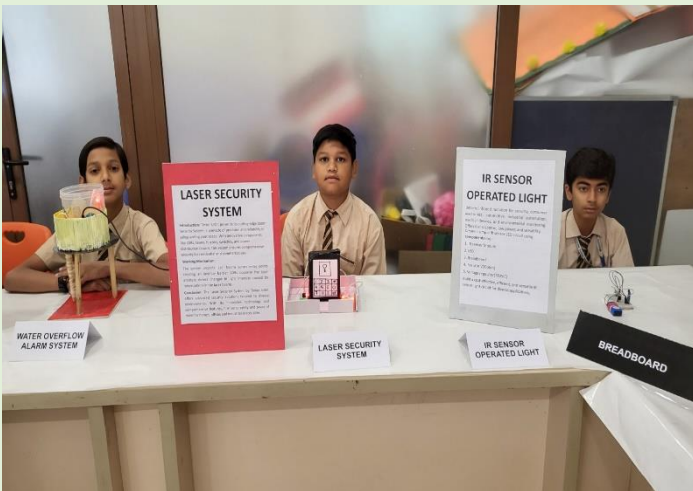
